What is it? "dyslexia is a specific reading disorder involving difficulty separating single words from groups of words and parts of words within each word" (Sulkes, 2022).

What to do with it...1) Be supportive and encouraging 2) Learn how to best support your child with accommodations and/or modifications 3) Build a team of support

What to expect...IEP – individual learning plan based on a student's particular needs, test findings, and learning style vs. 504 – for children who have completed remediation plans successfully and can decipher and transcribe reasonably well (Lowell, 2020)

- Learn to recognize and use the smallest sounds that makeup words (phonemes)
- Understand that letters and strings of letters represent these sounds and words (phonics)
- Understand what is read (comprehension)
- Read aloud to build reading accuracy, speed, and expression (fluency
- Build a vocabulary of recognized and understood words (Mayo Clinic Staff, 2022)
